Effective March 2015, all activities of Persatuan Kebajikan Generasi Gemilang (PKGG) have been taken over by Yayasan Generasi Gemilang.

Yayasan Generasi Gemilang (GG) is a charitable foundation incorporated as a company limited by guarantee under the Companies Act, 1965. GG continues to operate in its current structure and is governed by a Board of Trustees. Although we are officially known as a foundation instead of a society, our people, passion and commitment to our vision remains the same. This publication's reporting period is unique as it captures operational activities of PKGG for the entire 2014 and the transition to GG foundation up to March 2015.



MESSAGES

When we look at how far we have come in a short span of 5 years, it is humbling to remember how we began as a few projects run by just 5 people. Generasi Gemilang (GG) was founded in 2010 with the desire to positively influence the nation and impact the next generation regardless of race and creed.

5 years later, we celebrate a significant milestone being officially incorporated as a foundation in December 2014 – enabling us to continue pursuing our vision and invest further in the enrichment of individuals, families and communities.

From 5 people and a few projects we have multiplied manifold. 2014 was a year of new beginnings. We introduced new programs and reached out to new communities, schools and organisations. Cyber Wellness also partnered with Multimedia Development Corporation Sdn. Bhd. (MDec) in the Digital Malaysia Youth Community & Initiative Partner Program, a national ICT initiative to equip Malaysian youth with skillsets required for a developed digital economy. Through this, we mentored 2,965 students to be positive and balanced online users.

In March 2015, we were one of the lead agencies appointed by the Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development (Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWKM)) to be part of a task force to develop policies for Child Online Protection in Malaysia.





FINANCIAL OVERVIEW 2014

INCOME & EXPENDITURE

INCOME

GRANT FUNDING

2014 was a big year for GG as a grant recipient.

During the year, GG was awarded new program grants from The Edge Education Foundation & Microsoft Corporation. Additionally, GG was appointed as the trustee for funds collected from Nippon Paint (M) Sdn Bhd's Art Exhibition 2014. These funds are held by GG for distribution to children and the management of 3 children homes in 2015 onwards.

EARNED INCOME

GG recorded a 61% increase in earned income from schools and other learning institutions from our chargeable programs. This was largely due to our collaboration effort with the Multimedia Development Corporation (MDEC) which provided us funds to conduct our Cyberwellness programs to 10 new schools.

This year GG also saw an 88% increase in earned income from our corporate partnerships following the growth of the CSR efforts by our partners. We are tremendously honored to be part of the ambitious plans of our various partners that contributes positively to our nation.

EXPENDITURE

PROGRAM SPENDING

GG's overall spending on our programs has increased largely in line with our grants received. The additional funding has allowed us to channel more direct benefits to our community and school clients during the year.

STAFFING

To support the increasing demand for GG's services, we have continued to increase headcount to our staff team during the year. The average headcount of FY2014 was 37 staff as compared to FY2013 with an average headcount of 25.

GENERAL & ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS

We added an additional office premise during the year, providing more workspace and training facilities to sustain our organization's growth. During the financial period, the entire employment and operations of Persatuan Kebajikan Generasi Gemilang Kuala Lumpur dan Selangor (PKGG) was transferred to a charitable foundation known as YAYASAN GENERASI GEMILANG (GG Foundation) with the purpose of expansion of operations. GG Foundation assumed and adopted all contracts, grants and commitments of PKGG effective 31st March 2015.

The audited period was extended to cover 1 January 2014 till 31 March 2015 and the financial statements of these periods are disclosed in the accompanying pages.

Persatuan Kebajikan Generasi Gemilang has since been dissolved by approval of the Registrar of Societies.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS 2014

INCOME

CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions are funds donated to support GG's mission and programs. Of the amount, 56% came from individual donors, with the balance from various private and public organisations. These funds are received in the form of cash and cash equivalents throughout the year.

For the financial year, contributions made up 64% of the overall income received. This was significantly lower than in FY2013 (at 81%) due to the development of our other income sources.

All contributions received in the year are in compliance with our Donation Policy; refer to our website for more information on our guidelines.

GOVT FUNDING & GRANTS

Govt Funding & Grants are restricted amounts utilised for specific expenditures approved by each grant provider. These made up 13% of total funding for the year with a marked increased from FY2013 (at 1%). All grants received in 2014 were from private organisations and awarded to us with specific utilisation restrictions. Grants utilised for the year were

- 1. Grant received from Hong Leong Foundation in support towards our Pusat Bimbingan Pelajar program. Through this grant, we were able to provide basic school provisions, better quality educational trips, high achievement rewards and many other benefits to the students under our program. This marks the second year of the program grant.
- **2.** Grant received from Microsoft Corporation for the XLR8 program, aimed at helping youth's accelerate their future through basic Microsoft skills and character building program.
- **3.** Grant received from Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad for staffing costs in relation to our scope of work on PRU*kasih*, Financial Education and other community related efforts in cooperation with our partner.

EARNED INCOME

Earned Income are program service fees. These fees are received with regards to our programs and

with regards to our programs and workshops conducted for schools and organisations.


Overall, we improved our earned income by 83% from 2013 through increased workshops and sessions for youth participants and expansion of community programs in collaboration with private sector organisations.

OTHER INCOME

Other income includes income from sale of t-shirt merchandise and membership fees received throughout the year.

EXPENSES

PROGRAM EXPENSES

Program Expenses includes program staff costs, program materials costs, related marketing expenses and directly attributable overhead costs.

Spending on Youth Development and Community Development increased by 40% and 50% respectively compared to FY2013.

The overall increase in spending was largely arising from spending on grant funded programs. Additionally GG incurred higher expenditure across all our services on program staffing and material costs in support of increased frequency and number of programs conducted.

GENERAL & ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES


General & Administrative Expenses covers support staff costs, premise, administrative and merchandise expense.

In 2014, general & administrative expenses grew by 41%. This was attributed to an additional premise rented during the year and increase in rental expenses of our existing premise. GG also incurred higher administrative costs in relation to the transition of our activities to Yayasan Generasi Gemilang.

Despite the general growth of our organisation, we have successfully been able to maintain these supporting service costs at 12% (2013: 12%) of our total expenditure.


PROGRAM SPENDING BY DEPARTMENTS

FY2014 (In RM'000)




